"My name is Tommy. I'm a 10th grader at Loma Linda Academy in California. I have known my mentor, Ms. Ivonne, for four years. I usually help her with chores around her home and yard. Today, my visit was very different.

I rang the doorbell - no answer. I called her phone - no answer. I assumed she was sleeping or didn't hear me since she has some hearing deficits. I began to knock on her bedroom window. Both of her dogs were barking loudly, but still no answer. I became worried so I called her landlord asking if she had an extra key so we could check on Ms. Ivonne. The landlord came to the house, but her key didn't work. I found an open window, crawled in, and found Ms. Ivonne collapsed on the floor. I lifted her on to a chair and asked what happened. She had fallen the day before. She had spent 19 hours on the hard floor, unable to move, because her leg was deformed.



Ms. Ivonne has had surgery but can't come home yet because she needs frequent physical therapy and wound care for the pressure sores. Unfortunately, she has also tested positive for COVID 19. Until I can see her again, I'm spending time taking care of her home and yard."
