



Understanding PFE Guidelines

Students and mentors will be matched one-to-one.

PFE is designed to allow one student to build a personal relationship with one mentor, not only for the companionship and assistance for the mentor, but also for the enrichment and development of the student. Individual visits provide a neutral environment where the student and mentor can let their guard down and focus on one another. If a student had more than one mentor OR a mentor had multiple students, the singular focus on the friendship (intended by PFE) might suffer.
